self-portrait	When an artist makes of picture of themselves.
facial features	Eyes, nose, mouth, ears, eyebrows, hair
skin tone	The shades of a person's skin.
primary colours	Primary colours are red, yellow and blue. Primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours.
secondary colours	Secondary colours are green, orange and purple.
colour wheel	A circle with different coloured sectors used to show the relationship between colours.
cubism	A way of painting and drawing where the artist shows more than one view of something in the same picture, like looking at many sides of a cube at once.
