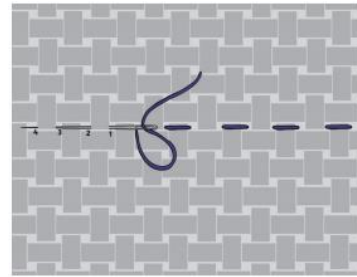
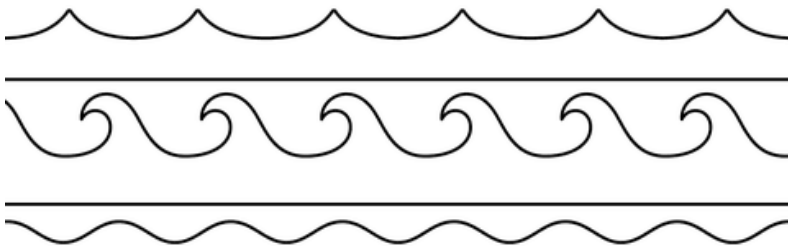

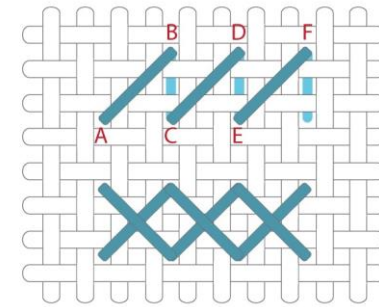
Repeating wave patterns

Words You Need To Know

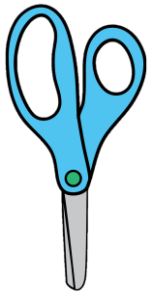
textiles	A type of cloth or woven fabric; or a form of art.
fabric	Cloth produced by weaving or knitting textiles fibres.
thread	A long, thin strand of cotton or other material used to make fabrics or join them together.
sew	Join, fasten or repair something by making stitches with a needle and thread.
embellish	Make something more attractive by the addition of a decoration.
stitch	A loop of thread used in sewing.
needle	A thin piece of metal with a point at the end and an eye at the other, used in sewing
Binca	Firm canvas with holes for sewing.
texture	The feel of something, or how something looks like it feels.
pattern	An arrangement of shapes, colours or lines that are repeated.

Whipped stitch is created by working a row of running stitch, then weaving in and out of the surface thread with a second colour thread.

Sticky Knowledge

- Putting thread through the needle, so you are ready to sew, is called **'threading the needle'**. It can be a bit tricky; it needs a steady hand and lots of patience!
- Running stitch is a simple line of straight stitches with the needle going up through the hole, down through the next and continuing, It is useful to think of it like the Loch Ness monster, coming up and down out of the water!

Key Skills

- Show pattern by weaving with paper, fabric and thread.
- Show pattern by stitching with thread.
- Thread a needle, cut and trim fabric, and knot thread.
- *This part of a needle is called the **eye**. It's where the thread goes through.*
