



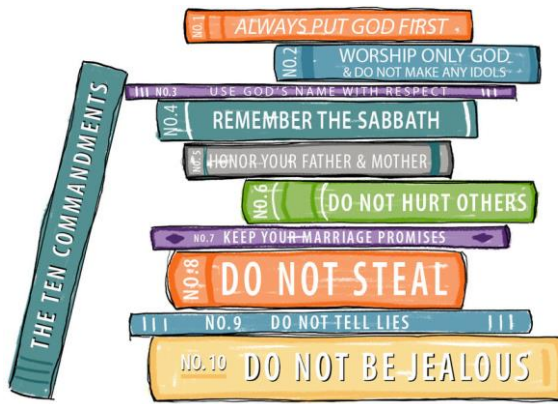
# Year 4 Religious Education: Judaism



## What is the best way for a Jew to show commitment to God?

### Key Vocabulary

<b>Ten Commandments</b>	Laws or rules handed down to Moses by God on Mount Sinai.
<b>Shabbat</b>	The Sabbath, observed each Saturday as a day of religious worship.
<b>Seder</b>	Home-based ceremonial meal during Passover.
<b>synagogue</b>	Jewish place of worship.
<b>Torah</b>	Jewish laws and teachings.
<b>Bar Mitzvah</b>	A boy's coming of age at 13 years old.
<b>Bat Mitzvah</b>	A girl's coming of age at 12 years old.
<b>Mitzvot</b>	The Torah contains 613 Mitzvot or commandments. Commonly known as good deeds.
<b>Tu B'Shevat</b>	Jewish holiday known as the New Year for Trees.
<b>Shema</b>	Jewish prayer affirming belief in one God.
