

Year 4 Religious Education: Christianity



Do people need to go to church to show they are Christians?

Key \	Vocabulary
Church	A place of worship where Christians go for worship and prayer.
Holy Communion	Christians have a special 'meal at church to do just what Jesus did. They break bread to remember his body (death) and drink juice/wine to remember his blood. Christians remember that Jesus died for them and forgave them.
John the Baptist	John the Baptist was Jesus' cousin and understood Jesus' special purpose on earth, hence baptising him in the River Jordan.
baptism	Baptism is a ceremony that symbolises a commitment to living a life as a Christian. Holy water is put on a person being baptised by a church leader as a symbol of being cleansed and made ready for a new life for God.
worship	A private or public display of emotion used to communicate with God.
