
Year 4 Art: Anglo-Saxon Weaving Weaving cloth

Subject Specific Vocabulary

weaving	A process where you interlace threads together to make fabric.
wool	The soft, thick hair that grows on the bodies of sheep and some other animals:
yarn	Thread used for making cloth or for knitting.
dye	To change the colour of something using a special liquid.
fabric	Cloth or woven material.
loom	A piece of equipment for weaving.
weft	The threads that go across the length of a piece of cloth or a loom.
warp	The threads that go along the length of a piece of cloth or a loom.







Sticky Knowledge

- The Anglo-Saxons used weaving to make their clothes, sails for their ships, decorations for their houses, blankets, bags and more.
- It was a lengthy process that started with sheering the sheep for their wool.
- The wool was then washed, combed and spun into long strands called yarn. The yarn was then dyed using a mixture of plants and natural resources before being weaved into fabric on a loom.
